On April 25, 2016 1885 Transportation, LLC dba Badlands Taxi, Miles City, Montana requests transfer of PSC No. 417 to Bestway Taxi, LLC dba Badlands Taxi, Miles City, Montana. The application was noticed to the

1. Yellowstone Pipeline Company (D2016.5.44) (Dagan)

On May 23, 2016, Yellowstone Pipe Line Company (YPL) filed with the Montana Public Service Commission (Commission) an application to implement Proposed Montana Tariffs PSC No. 48.4 and PSC Tariff 49.8. PSC Tariff 48.4 cancels PSC Tariff 48.3. The current PSC Tariff 48.3 was at the ceiling and must be decreased 2.0135% for shipments between Billings and Alkali Creek terminal. PSC Tariff No. 49.8 cancels PSC Tariff 49.7. Yellowstone Pipeline is requesting to hold rates flat for pipeline movements the terminals in Bozeman, Helena, Great Falls, and Missoula. Yellowstone Pipeline represents that the current customers have been notified of the proposed change and do not object to it.

2. Phillips 66 Pipeline LLC (D2016.5.45) (Dagan)

On May 23, 2016, Phillips 66 Pipeline LLC (Phillips Pipeline) filed with the Montana Public Service Commission (Commission) an application to implement Montana Tariff PSC No. 3.6, cancelling Tariff PSC 3.5, and to implement Tariff PSC 4.6, cancelling Tariff PSC No. 4.5. Tariff 4.6 decreases the rates approximately 2.0135%, for pipeline shipments between Alkali Creek Junction and Burlington Northern Railroad, Laurel Montana and is consistent with the May 14, 2016 Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Order. Tariff 3.6 raises the rate approximately 2% to the allowable FERC index ceiling and affects pipeline shipments between Cut Bank Station, Glacier County, Montana, and Billings and Laurel, Yellowstone County Montana. Phillips Pipeline represents that the current shippers have been notified of the proposed change and do not object to it.

Transportation Notice Items: Motor carriers with proper standing may protest applications. Protests related to an application for Class A, B, and E passenger authority is limited to a protest of the motor carrier's ability to meet the requirements of

Mont. Code Ann. §§ 69-12-323(5) and 69-12-415. Protests must include the proper fee, as required by Mont. Admin. R. 38.3.402(c), and conform to the requirements at Mont. Admin. R. 38.3.405 or 38.3.406 as applicable. A protest form is available on the Commission's website at <http://psc.mt.gov/transportation>. If no written protests are received by the deadline, the Commission may issue a final order on the application without a public hearing, pursuant to Mont. Code Ann. § 69-12-321.

1. Frontier Communications of Montana N2016.4.37

On May 27, 2016 Citizens Telecommunications Company of Montana dba Frontier Communications of Montana filed a Motion for Protective Order in Docket No. N2016.4.37 – IN THE MATTER of the 2016 Annual Certification of Montana Eligible Telecommunications Carriers - FCC Annual Reporting Requirements. Frontier wishes to protect certain detailed service outage and unfilled service request information contained in the FCC Form 481 report lines 200, 320, and 330.
