**NOTICE OF COMMISSION ACTION GRANTING INTERVENTION**

On February 14, 2011, Clark Fork Coalition (CFC) filed a timely petition to intervene in the above-captioned docket. On February 23, 2011, Mountain Water Co. (Mountain) filed an objection to CFC’s intervention. On March 7, 2011, CFC filed a response to Mountain’s objection. On March 14, 2011, Mountain filed a reply to CFC’s response. On March 15, 2011, CFC filed an objection to Mountain’s March 14, 2011 response. On March 21, 2011, CFC filed a reply to Mountain’s reply.

Mountain argued that CFC lacks standing to intervene. CFC responded that (1) it and its members have a substantial interest in this proceeding, (2) they will be directly affected by it, and (3) CFC’s participation will be in the public interest and will not unduly broaden the issues in the proceeding.

The Public Service Commission (Commission) finds that CFC has met the requirements of administrative standing pursuant to ARM 38.2.2405. The Commission did not make a determination on judicial standing.

At a duly noticed work session on March 22, 2011, the Public Service Commission granted intervention to CFC.
