The Commission, having taken evidence and being fully advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On February 29, 1988, Molerway Freight Lines, Inc., P.O. Box 21609, Billings, Montana, filed an application with the Montana Public Service Commission under Title 69, MCA, for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity authorizing the transportation of general commodities, except dangerous Class A & B explosives, Class B, between all points and places within Stillwater and Sweetgrass Counties, Montana.

2. In accordance with Section 69-23-321, MCA, as amended, this matter was noticed to the public March 4, 1988. That notice said in pertinent part:

If no written protests are received by March 24, 1988, a hearing may not be held and a final order may be issued in this Docket. If a protest is received, a

hearing will be scheduled. Individual notice of the hearing will be given only to Protestants and Applicant.

The application included affidavits of support.

3. Protests were filed by H.F. Johnson, Inc., Getter Trucking, Inc., and Bill's Mobile Home Transport, Inc. On April 19, 1988, Applicant restrictively amended the application and all protests were subsequently withdrawn.

4. The record of this application is available for inspection at the Public Service Commission Office, 2701 Prospect Avenue, Helena, Montana 59620-2601.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Montana Public Service Commission properly exercises jurisdiction over the parties and subject matter in this proceeding.

2. The Commission afforded all parties interested in this proceeding proper notice and an opportunity to participate.

3. Public Convenience and Necessity require a grant of the authority sought by the Applicant.

ORDER

NOW THEREFORE, at a session of the Public Service Commission, Department of Public Service Regulation of the State of Montana, held in its offices at 2701 Prospect Avenue, Helena, Montana, on the 2nd day of May, 1988, there being present a quorum of Commissioners, there came regularly before the Commission for final action the matters and things in Docket No. T-9210, and the Commission being fully advised in the premises;

IT IS ORDERED by the Commission that the application of for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity IS GRANTED to the following extent: Class B: General commodities except dangerous Class A and B explosives between all points and places within Stillwater and Sweetgrass Counties, Montana. Limitations: Transportation of the following is prohibited: (1) Petroleum and petroleum products in bulk in tank vehicles.(2) Mobile homes, buildings and buildings in sections.(3) Mercer type commodities (as defined in T.E. Mercer and G.E. Mercer Extension - Oil Field Commodities, 74 MCC 459) in truck load lots.(4) Materials or equipment which, because of their size or weight, require the use of special equipment;(5) Transportation using lowboy and flatbed trailers.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a full, true and correct copy of this order be sent forthwith by certified mail to the Applicant herein.

THE FOREGOING ORDER was adopted by the Department of Public Service Regulation of the State of Montana, Public Service Commission, IN OPEN SESSION at Helena, Montana, this 2nd day of May, 1988, by a vote of 5 - 0.
