(300) In the matter of US WEST Docket N2000.6.83 - On June 14, 2000 US WEST filed Tariff Transmittal 00-20 "Eliminate Toll-PAC" to eliminate the Toll-Pac offering. This special toll offering was route specific for calling between designated exchanges (Alberston to Missoula and Fort Peck to Glasgow). There are currently no customers purchasing this service. Commissioner Rowe moved to approve the tariff filing. Commissioner McCaffree seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(301) In the matter of US WEST Docket N2000.6.84 - On June 14, 2000 US WEST filed Tariff Transmittal 00-21 "Revisions - Operator Verification Service" to revise the language for operator verification and interrupt to allow charging for these services for data communications in addition to voice. Presently, US West has authority to charge only when voice communication is on the line. Due to the increase of data communications/internet connectivity, US WEST wants the ability to charge for verification of line status when data is on the line. It also provides for the application of charges for verification when it can be determined that the line is in an "off hook" status. There is no change in the rate requested. Commissioner McCaffree moved to approve the tariff filing revisions. Commissioner Feland seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(302) In the matter of U S WEST COMMUNICATIONS- Docket N2000.6.87 - On June 15, 2000, U S WEST filed Tariff Transmittal 00-24 to introduce a custom calling feature – Wireless Extension. Wireless Extension allows a customer to integrate their wireline and wireless service. The service is a call forwarding feature that allows the customer to give out one number and be reached either on their wireline or their wireless phone. Commissioner Rowe moved to approve the tariff filing. Commissioner McCaffree seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(303) In the matter of T-00.46.PCN - On May 3, 2000, Montana Waste Systems, Inc., Great Falls, Montana filed an application for the following:

Class D - Solid waste between all points and places in the State of Montana. LIMITATION: Transportation must originate at a licensed transfer facility and terminate in Cascade County, Montana

The application was noticed to the public on June 9, 2000. Applicant requests that the application be withdrawn and the docket closed. Commissioner Anderson moved to approve the request for withdrawal and closure of the docket. Commissioner McCaffree seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(304) In the matter of T-00.39.ST - On April 19, 2000 Jones Brothers Trucking, Inc. dba Executive Limousine Service, Missoula, Montana filed an application to transfer PSC No. 9096 to William P. Jones dba Executive Limousine Service, Missoula, Montana. Application was noticed to the public on May 5, 2000.

Class B- Passengers by limousine service from points in Missoula County to all points and places in the State of Montana and return. Limitations: 1) Transportation is limited to six (6) passengers or less. 2) Transportation as a jitney or taxi is prohibited. 3) All transportation must originate and terminate in Missoula County, Montana. Transportation shall not originate from outside of Missoula County. 4) Transportation shall be provided to passengers by reservation only. Transportation or fares shall not be solicited form the vehicle while it is stopped, standing, or parked. 5) The hiring of the vehicle for transportation must be for the use of the entire vehicle by a single passenger or group of passengers traveling together. The solicitation of individual passengers to constitute a full load is prohibited.

Commissioner Rowe moved to grant the transfer of PSC 9096. Commissioner McCaffree seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(305) In the matter of T-00.48.ST - On May 18, 2000 Cody Bus Lines, Inc., Red Lodge, Montana filed an application to transfer PSC No. 8968 to Yellowstone Winder Guides, Inc. dba Grayline of Yellowstone, West Yellowstone, Montana. Application was noticed on June 9, 2000.

Class B - Passengers, baggage and express within the City of West Yellowstone, Montana, and a twenty-five (25) mile radius thereof. Limitation: Transportation is limited to utilization of vehicles with rated seating capacity of ten (10) passengers or less.

Commissioner McCaffree moved to grant the transfer of PSC No. 8968. Commissioner Feland seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(306) In the matter of T-00.49.ST- On May 23, 2000 Duane & Debbie Bartlett dba Camelot Limousine Service, Missoula, Montana filed an application to transfer a portion of PSC No. 9241 to Albert L. Guay III dba Sunset Limousine Service, Butte, Montana. Application was noticed on June 9, 2000.

That portion of 9241 to be transferred is as follows:

Class B - Passengers and personal baggage in limousine service: 1) Between all points and places in the following counties: Silver Bow, Deer Lodge, Powell, Granite, and Beaverhead; and 2) From all points and places in Silver Bow, Deer Lodge, Powell, Granite and Beaverhead Counties to all points and places in Montana and return. Limitations: 1) Transportation is limited to no more than eight passengers per vehicle per trip. 2) Operations as a taxi or cab is prohibited. 3) Transportation shall be provided to passengers only by advance reservation of at least two (2) hours. 4) Solicitation of train crews for work-related transportation is prohibited. 5) Any return movements from points and places outside Silver Bow, Deer Lodge, Powell, Granite and Beaverhead are limited to those passengers originating from these counties.

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Commissioner Rowe moved to grant the requested transfer of PSC No. 9241. Commissioner Feland seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(307) In the matter of TN2051- Montana Tariff Bureau, Agent on behalf of its members Two Shews, Inc., Billings, Montana dba Billings Yellow Cab and Mark Foos dba City Cab, Billings, Montana, request a fuel surcharge be added to Passenger Tariff No. 3. Surcharge is requested in the amount of \$.25 per fare effective July 10, 2000 and expiring on October 8, 2000. This represents a renewal of the original fuel surcharge effective April 11, 2000 to July 10, 2000.

Commissioner McCaffree moved to approve the fuel surcharge continuation for 90 days. Commissioner Rowe seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(308) In the matter of TN2052 - Central Cab & Transfer Co., Butte, Montana requests permission to continue the lease of PSC No. 602 to Tucker Transportation, Inc., Butte, Montana for a twelve month period, June 23, 2000 to June 23, 2001.

Class C - Property as specified, props, drops and scenery for shows and trunks, baggage, beer, light housekeeping fixtures and light moving jobs, within the City of Butte, and not over a radius of five (5) miles from the City of Butte.

Class B - Persons, within the City of Butte, Montana, and between points tributary thereto, but within a distance not exceeding fifty (50) miles in any direction from said city. Limitations: Regular or scheduled service as a jitney or bus is prohibited on or over any route.

Commissioner Rowe moved to approve the request to continue the lease of PSC No. 602 for a period of 1 year. Commissioner McCaffree seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

(329) In the matter of BLACK HILLS POWER & LIGHT Docket D2000.6.90; On June 23, 2000, BHP&L filed a Quarterly Fuel Rate Rider application. A Notice of Opportunity for Public Hearing was issued on June 26, 2000. Requests for hearing were due by July 24, 2000. No requests have been received. This application will decrease rates by \$5,175 over the base cost of fuel approved in Docket No. 83.4.25. A default order has been drafted. LIMITATIONS: 1) Transportation is limited to movements originating in Beaverhead, Jefferson and Madison Counties. 2) Transportation movements originating in Ennis, Montana and a five (5) mile radius thereof and destined to Big Sky, Montana and a twenty-five (25) mile radius thereof are prohibited. 3) Transportation movements originating in Gallatin County are prohibited. 4) Transportation

movements originating in Beaverhead County will not terminate in Silver Bow County.

Commissioner Feland moved to grant the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity. Commissioner Rowe seconded the motion, which passed unanimously. Commissioner Anderson voted aye.

(332) In the matter of T-00.53.OTSC; On July 5, 2000 an Order to Show Cause was issued to Ryder Student Transportation Services, Inc., St. Louis, Missouri for failure to comply with vehicle registration requirements. The Order was sent by certified mail and received by the company on July 10, 2000. There was been no response from the carrier.

Limitations: Transportation services originating or terminating in Billings, Montana, or in the above counties, is prohibited. Transportation service within Fergus and Stillwater Counties is restricted to closed-door operations. 3) Transportation within Carbon County is prohibited.
