FRONT RANGE PEIPELINE, LLC 2022.08.080 (JOEL)

On August 2, 2022, Front Range Pipeline (Front Range) filed MTPSC Tariff No.27 cancelling MTPSC Tariff No. 26. Front Range is proposing to raise the existing rate in cents per barrel for movements on this pipeline under the 2022 Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Oil Pipeline Index. The rates will be as identified below.

Santa Rita Station – Glacier County, Montana to Great Falls – Cascade County, Montana 64.26.

Santa Rita Station – Glacier County, Montana to Cut Bank – Glacier County, Montana 32.12.

Cut Bank – Glacier County, Montana to Laurel – Yellowstone County, Montana 144.49.

Cut Bank – Glacier County, Montana to Great Falls – Cascade County, Montana 64.26.

The filing is consistent with the May 2022 Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) Oil Pipeline Index.
