FRONT RANGE PIPELINE, LLC 2023.05.043 (Joel Tierney)

On May 25, 2023, Front Range Pipeline (“Front Range”) filed Montana PSC Tariff No. 28 canceling Montana PSC Tariff No. 27.

Front Range proposes to increase the rates for transportation on its pipeline to the allowable ceiling under the 2023 Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) Oil Pipeline Index. The rates will be as identified below.

Santa Rita Station – Glacier County, Montana to Great Falls – Cascade County, Montana: 72.82 cents per barrel.

Santa Rita Station – Glacier County, Montana to Cut Bank – Glacier County, Montana: 36.40 cents per barrel.

Cut Bank – Glacier County, Montana to Laurel – Yellowstone County, Montana: 163.74 cents per barrel.

Cut Bank – Glacier County, Montana to Great Falls – Cascade County, Montana: 72.82 cents per barrel.

Santa Rita Station – Glacier County, Montana to Laurel – Yellowstone County, Montana: 165.22 cents per barrel.

Buffalo – Judith Basin County, Montana to Laurel – Yellowstone County, Montana: 118.95 cents per barrel.

Transportation Notice Items: Motor carriers with proper standing may protest Applications. Protests related to an Application for Class A and E passenger authority is limited to a protest of the motor carrier’s ability to meet the requirements of Mont. Code Ann. §§ 69–12–323(5) and 69–12–415. Protests must include the proper fee, as required by Mont. Admin. R. 38.3.402(c), and conform to the requirements at Mont. Admin.
