1. Insight Energy LLC (Amanda Webster)

On August 29, 2023, Insight Energy LLC (“Insight Energy”) filed an application to become a natural gas broker in the State of Montana. Insight Energy intends to broker natural gas contracts between large commercial and industrial clients. Insight Energy does not provide any generation of power services, scheduling, or ancillary services, and does not intend to broker contracts with any residential or small commercial customers.

Transportation Notice Items: Motor carriers with proper standing may protest Class A, D, and E applications. Protests related to an application for Class A and E passenger authority is limited to a protest of the motor carrier’s ability to meet the requirements of Mont. Code Ann. §§ 69–12–323(5) and 69–12–415. Protests must include the proper fee, as required by Mont. Admin. R. 38.3.402(c), and conform to the requirements at Mont. Admin. R. 38.3.405 or 38.3.406 as applicable. Protest forms are available on the Commission’s website under Regulated Utilities, Compliance Materials, Transportation. On September 20, 2023, the Montana Public Service Commission processed a new telecommunications registration from Chase Data Corp. (REG-10)

2. G&G Garbage, LLC (Amanda Webster)

On September 11, 2023, the Montana Public Service Commission, through delegation to staff, approved the lease of Class D motor carrier Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PSC No. 2740 from Kurtz Sanitation, Inc. to G&G Garbage, LLC for a period of one year commencing on the date of approval. The authority granted under this lease includes authority to transport refuse within the City of Glendive, Montana and a twenty-five-mile radius thereof, under select limitations.

3. G&G Garbage, LLC (Amanda Webster)

On September 11, 2023, the Montana Public Service Commission, through delegation to staff, approved the lease of Class D motor carrier Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity PSC No. 9297 from James A. Jones d/b/a Oilfield Maintenance Company to G&G Garbage, LLC for a period of one year commencing on the date of approval. The authority granted under this lease includes authority to transport garbage, solid waste, and debris between all points and places in Fallon, Carter, and Wibaux Counties.
